KENYA

We were honored to be able to take surgical teams into Malindi, Kenya on two occasions this year. The teams worked out of two hospitals, the *Malindi District Hospital* (a government hospital), and *Tawfiq Hospital* (a community Islamic Hospital). It was an incredible blessing and opportunity to be able to work side by side with Muslim health care professionals, to show them the love of Christ, in this day and age where in many parts of the world there is such animosity between Christians and Muslims. In Malindi, however, you can thank Jim and Laura Reppart, of *Caris Foundation International – Kenya*, for working diligently to open communications with civic and government leaders to make this partnership possible. We ask for continued prayer on their behalf that God continues to open doors so that Christ can be shown to the Muslim community in Malindi.

And because she was scared she couldn't relax and have the surgery she wanted. She was only 10 years old and virtually blind due to cataracts. But Dr. Laia told her that if she could be less scared and relax, that tomorrow he would be able to do magic for her. She would be able to see the beauty of the world. The next day Puspita Sari was less scared and had her necessary surgery. The nurse removed her bandages and she walked about freely. Then Puspita Sari asked for her Mom. She didn't know what her Mom and Dad looked like. She couldn't find them. Later, without her knowing who they were, her Mom and Dad entered the room. Her Mom called her and Puspita answered by going to her, pointing at her and saying, "That's my Mom." Puspita Sari was ten years old when she saw her Mom for the first time! Thank you for your contributions that made all this possible. The cost for surgery for both eyes, including the lens implant, was only \$250.00.


I N D O N E S I A

churches and introduce non-believers to Christ by meeting their basic needs in the setting of natural disasters, i.e. tsunamis with subsequent flooding. Also, we visited the *Yokhebed Children's Home*, an orphanage meeting the needs of abused children, providing them a safe haven where they can grow and learn the love of a graceful, peaceful God.

PHILIPPINES

On our first trip of the year to the Philippines, the mission was under the direction of Dr. Sam Cariago. We treated 4,317 patients and performed over 100 surgeries. The mission was in a remote area, accessible only by boat. Because of bad weather, travelling there and back was a special challenge to the team members.

Around-the-World in 28 Days

Dr. John Bailey and I began our journey on October 12 and returned home November 9, 2009. Amazing people met us everywhere we stopped, people like you, who give of themselves like Christ, to restore those around them to health or to healthy relationships and families. You can be sure every person we met, like us, was broken in some way or another, but that didn't stop many of them from drawing strength from above and doing their best to help others. The growing results of these acts of kindness around the world is undeniable. People are rebuilding homes and tending to the sick. Some who were blind can now see again. Kids whose families were taken from them are now realizing the love of an eternal father and being family to other kids in similar circumstances. The lives of the poor are being transformed by goats, worms, and the love of their neighbors. Some of the finest surgeons in the United States are bringing healing by giving of their time and expertise. It was a great honor to witness all of these things being done with funds from *Body and Soul Ministries* around the world.

In Manila we met with church leaders like Jhun Patricio who has planted multiple congrega-

tions in the Manila area and now is leading believers in an effort to rebuild homes and provide needed food and supplies to those whose lives have been overturned by two recent typhoons. We also met with self supporting preacher, Danny DeVera, who lost his own home in the disaster, yet he is working to rebuild the homes of members of his congregation first. We worshipped with our brothers at the *Metro South Church of Christ* in Manila, planted by Jhun Patricio. The highlight of our time in Manila was the day we were able to tour the still flooded Pasig neighborhood in Manila where six people were baptized, having come to belief through the work of compassionate Christians.

On October 26 we said our goodbyes in Manila and moved on to Indonesia where we were able to visit the beautiful *Yokhebed Children's Home* near Gunung Sitoli, Indonesia. This impressive facility was built this past year with *BandS* and *Caris Foundation's* funds and is now home to seventeen abused children. Bajarudin Zaluthu and his wife Wati devote their time now in ministry loving these children. Children here, once smothered in insecurity and violence, are finding a safe place to learn, live,

and experience the blessings of family. Dennis Cady operates this home.

On October 29, the day before leaving Indonesia for Kenya, Dr. Bailey and I met with Marganda Marbun and Erni Halim of *TEARS International*, and with Dr. Pinto and Dr. Jusni, eye surgeons, to arrange for cataract surgeries in 2010. *BandS* and *Caris Foundation International* has already funded more than 2000 cataract surgeries in Indonesia and other countries. I remember my trip to Nias in 2008 where a man stood up to thank Dr. Bailey for the work *BandS* is doing in this area. The man echoed words from the Bible when he said, "I don't know you, and you don't know me. But yesterday I was blind and now I can see." The meeting was a blessing to witness and was more of a celebration than anything else. Everyone happily agreed to provide for four hundred more eye surgeries in 2010.

Our return to Malindi, Kenya in late October was brought about by the interest of an extremely talented group of surgeons led by Dr. Jim Netterville. This team was made up primarily of head and neck surgeons. We also had some volunteers back from

our June trip including Dr. Al Smith, an anesthesiologist, and Dr. Brian Camazine, a general surgeon. Operations once again took place daily at both *Tawfiq* and *Malindi District Hospital* and brought much needed healing to many. These fine doctors bring expertise not otherwise available in Kenya and tackle an overloaded surgical schedule, working on patients who would never be able to afford the surgery in Kenya otherwise.

This was the trip of a lifetime. Dr. Bailey and I both missed our families a great deal, but what a blessing to witness some of the restorative work of Christ going on throughout the world. It was plain to see what wonderful work is being done in the name of Christ because so many of you care enough to give so generously. The words that continually came to mind during this great trip were from Revelation 21: 5, "Behold, I am making all things new." That's exactly what we see Him doing in people's lives thanks to the work of these great volunteers and people who generously give.

While in China, a family group of John, Rosalyn and Caitlin Bailey, Lee Ann and Hutton Brown, Jared Oberkirsh and Kara Kelley visited the *John Connor Brown Christian Care Center*, a children's home built in honor of John Connor Brown.
